Professor Jessica Townsend to Participate in Upcoming ASME Panel

The American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) has invited Associate Professor of Mechanical Engineering, Jessica Townsend to participate in a Socratic Dialogue on critical issues surrounding engineering workforce development and the impact of engineering on global development. The panel will bring together U.S. Science Envoy and founding president of Engineers without Borders Dr. Bernard Amadei ; ASME President Marc Goldsmith; Virginia Tech College of Engineering Dean Richard Benson; and leaders from industry, government, academia and NGOs to grapple with the question of how to inspire generations of engineers to solve global challenges.
