#### Johann Sebastian Bach

- Lived 1685-1750
- Prolific German composer and organist
- Contributed to the Baroque period
- Wide range of works:
  - Religious and secular
  - Choir, orchestra, solo instruments

#### Cello Suites Composition

- Composed between 1717-1723 while working at a court
- Autographed manuscript never found
- Four manuscripts found
  - Identical in notes
  - differ greatly in dynamics and articulation
- Most used version is a manuscript copied by Bach's second wife, Anna Magdalena

### Significance

- Suites neglected long after Bach's death
- Unaccompanied cello was a rarity in that time
- Bold venture in that time period
- Standard cello repertoire today
- Transcribed for many instruments
  - Viola, violin, lute, piano, bassoon, trombone

#### Interpretation

- Lack of original manuscript gives more freedom to the player
- Passed down through teachers
- Quote by Anner Bylsma:
  - "Nobody, it seems to me, will ever be totally happy about his [or her] performance of the Suites. There will still be so much untold..."
